During the Golden Age of Hollywood, the HOLLYWOOD STUDIO SYSTEM used to run something like this, with actors, writers, directors and others under contract with a particular studio and only working for that studio. Today, movies like *THE PRINCESS BRIDE* are created in a different way... The individual PRODUCTION COMPANIES hire different people for each project and then bring their projects to the studio for funding and distribution.

Movies like MAD HOT BALLROOM are called "INDIES," a short-cut term for "independent films." Indies use a third approach...They create the film themselves and enter the completed films into FILM FESTIVALS, where they hope distribution companies will buy the films and get them into movie theaters.
